Context 2018

- 15 male students on roll
- 10 students attended the main school, with attendance ranging from 19% to 95%, averaging at 66%
- 5 students accessed the EOTAS programme, with attendance ranging from 11% to 57%, averaging at 33% (this is based on the 'real' attendance figure rather than a reflection of the engagement of the students with their individual programmes)
- 2 out of 15 students attended New Park from yr 7 (13%)
- 10 out of 15 students attended New Park for the whole period of KS4 (67%)
- 10 out of 15 students had additional learning needs (67%)
- 14 out of 15 students had a diagnosis of ADHD and/or other relevant identified difficulties (93%)
- 4 students had special access arrangements for their GCSEs, with 5 more students being eligible but refusing to be assessed for it

Summative Analysis

- The 10 students on a school programme passed overall 31.5 GCSEs and equivalent exams (average of just over three each)
- The students who attended school exceeded estimated grades in 18 subjects and met them in 11 subjects and achieved lower grades in three subjects and failed 2 subjects through absence on the day of the exam
- On the EOTAS programme, students exceeded estimated grades in three subjects and met targets in 1 subject; all students achieved the Entry Levels they were entered for
(The above numbers do not tally with the overall numbers of qualifications achieved as some exams only count as 0.5 GCSEs)
- Overall, the 15 students on roll passed 82.5 exams (average of 5.5 exams per student)
- 5 students passed more than 6 exams, with three achieving 10.5 and 11 certificates
- Every single student has left with at least one externally recognised qualification; those who attended school regularly clearly gained the most qualifications!
- 11 students out of 15 have already signed up for college or training providers, with the last 4 still being supported by our Careers Adviser. New Park's Post 16 worker and our Careers Adviser support our young people over the summer and beyond till we believe they are settled in a placement that meets their needs. Only in those cases where all support and guidance is rejected, are there limits to what we can help the young person achieve post 16. (More official updates available early 2019)
