



Dear Parent/Guardian



We hope this letter finds you well.

We are aware that your child is on a waiting list for a neurodevelopmental assessment and that there are significant waits for this assessment. We know that this can be difficult and are sorry you are experiencing this. Please be assured that all services are working together so that your child is seen as quickly as possible.

Whilst you wait, Salford City Council is working with our partners from Salford Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS), Salford Information Advice and Support Services (SIASS), Salford Care Organisation and Salford Parent Carer Forum, to consider what support can be provided.

Salford City Council have a dedicated **Early Help Service**, that works with families who need some help and support. The Early Help Service can offer you an Early Help Worker to support you, your child and the wider the family. This could include direct work with your child and the family or support to access other services that may be required whilst your child is waiting for an assessment.

If you would like to access this support or hear more about it, you can make a request to arrange for an Early Help Worker to contact you directly.
