On 31st March we launched the Rail Safe Friendly. A movement that was introduced to raise safety awareness in all schools and decrease trespassing on the railways.

There are three different levels that your school can achieve: Bronze, Silver and Gold, click [here](#) for more information. The first level to achieve is Bronze, see details below:

### ***Bronze level***

To achieve the Bronze level, a school will need to have completed:

- A school will ensure that all pupils and teachers have watched the FREE rail safety broadcast either live or on demand via the Learn Live channel. Schools will need to register to access the videos.
- Schools will need to provide feedback via the Google Form after the broadcast has been viewed by the students.

- Schools will also need to sign up to the Switched On Rail Safety website to receive rail safety updates from Network Rail. <https://switchedonrailsafety.co.uk/>

Switched On is a new rail safety programme for 3-16 year olds that encourages young people to stay Switched On around the railway.
